ENTRANCE AS LPN

Students who are admitted under this policy must have a LPN license. According to IAI, LPN students will begin in NUR 168 with reduced hours and follow the nursing curriculum through graduation with reduced hours in NUR 169, NUR 226, and NUR 227.

LPN students with a current LPN license are admitted into Kishwaukee's Nursing Program with 14 hours credit according to Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) requirements. Listed below are additional requirements:

- Must meet all admission criteria;
- Current LPN license:
- PN graduation must be completed within the past two years or have worked at least 20 hours per week for 50% of their time while licensed as an LPN if they have graduated over two years ago;
- Submittance of the following:
 - o A satisfactory care plan;
 - o Pass a Pharmacology exam with an 80% or higher. Students who do not pass this exam will be required to take NUR 123 (Orientation to Pharmacology);
- All nursing transfer work must be completed within four years of the first nursing course completed;
- Students who have failed a nursing course at Kishwaukee or at another institution will have only one opportunity to complete the nursing curriculum at Kishwaukee
