Whitney Dulzo

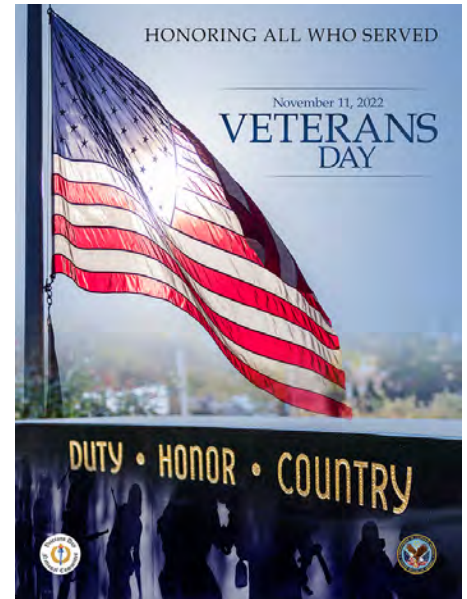
Spotlight a Vet

History Corner

Air Force

September 18, 1947

Known as the most recent branch of the U.S. military to be formed, the Air Force is also the largest and most technologically advanced air force in the world. Initially part of the United States Army, the USAF was formed as a separate branch of the military on 18 September 1947 under the National Security Act of 1947.

Important information regarding your Veteran Benefits

+The COVID waiver expired June 1, 2022. For Chapter 33 benefits you now must have at least one course in-residence (in-person or hybrid) to qualify for the maximum Housing Allowance benefit. Asynchronous coursework and synchronous coursework count as distance learning (all online). Full-time enrollment (12 or more credits) also qualifies for full MHA.

+Additionally, this also means that all remedial courses taken (less than 100 level) MUST be in-person. Online remedial courses are not covered by Federal Veteran Benefits. State benefits may cover online remedial coursework. Check with the Financial Aid office for more information.

+A request for benefits form MUST be submitted each semester you wish to utilize Veteran Benefits for your training.
