

# **View Academic Progress**


- 1) Login to your MyKish account.
- 2) Navigate to the "My Account" section, then locate the card labeled "Self-Service Student." From there, click on "Student Planning."




3) In the second box, click on "View Your Progress."



4) On the "My Progress" page, you'll see a full list of requirements for your current degree or certificate program. This screen also displays your current degree program and GPA.




5) On the "My Progress" page, you can view both the total number of credits you've earned and the number required for graduation. In the example below, dark green represents completed credits, light green indicates credits currently in progress, and yellow shows planned courses that haven't yet been registered.




6) On the "My Progress" page, you'll see a list of required courses displayed within your degree progress. Under each category, you'll find the following details:

## **Green for Completed/In Progress (Once Term Begins)**




## **Yellow for Planned (Not Registered)**




### **Red for Not Started**




#### **Blue for Fulfilled**
