Admittance into the EIU elementary education program requires a minimum between 2.65 cumulative GPA and passing score on ILTS Test of Academic Proficiency (or ACT/SAT waiver). In Addition to applying to EIU, students must also apply to be admitted to the elementary education program. Application deadlines are as follows: March 1 (fall term) and October 1 (spring term).
