Admittance into the ISU elementary education program requires a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and passing score on ILTS Test of Academic Proficiency (or ACT/SAT waiver). In Addition to applying to ISU, students must also apply to be admitted to the elementary education program. Application deadlines are as follows: September 1-January 15 (fall term) and April 1-August 1 (spring term)
