- Must have a minimum grade of "C" or equivalent in all major required coursework as well as the courses used to satisfy the NIU Foundational Studies writing and Oral communication requirements (ENGL 103, ENGL 203, and COMS 100).
- *** Minimum cumulative GPA to begin the Fifth Semester coursework and all courses after is a
 2.75. Passing of all prerequisites is required prior to entering the Fifth Semester at NIU: EPFE
 410, TLEE 282/EPS 282x, and LTIC 301. Passing EPS 304 is also required prior to 5th semester.
- Completion of Safety Tutorial is required prior to the Fifth Semester at NIU.
- A criminal background check (CBC) is required for enrollment in all clinical experiences. Students are responsible for contacting the appropriate school district office of their placement for information on how to obtain the required CBC.
- Annual verification of freedom from tuberculosis (TB test) before being allowed to participate in any clinical experience, including student teaching.
- Successful completion of the subject matter knowledge content test administered by the Illinois Licensure Testing System is required prior to enrolling in the Eighth Semester at NIU.
- Successful completion of the EdTPA is required prior to licensure.
