Agreement type	Transfer Admission Guaranteed Agreement (TAG)
Summary and Benefits of the Program	This agreement will provide guaranteed admission in many of UIC's bachelor's degree programs, offering Kish transfer students certainty if they plan to attend UIC later.
Requirements:	<p>Apply for TAG participation no later than the first two weeks of the student's final year at Kishwaukee College.</p> <p>Earn a minimum transfer GPA of 3.00 overall and in required major preparation courses.</p> <p>Successfully complete the community college equivalent of required courses listed on the program's section of the TAG website.</p> <p>Transfer to UIC within three years of signing the TAG Pathways Participation Form.</p> <p>The student will need to meet with a Kish advisor and create a Transferology account.</p> <p>The student must apply to UIC in either February or September depending upon the semester the student plan to enter UIC.</p> <p>The student will need to meet with a Kish advisor to verify eligibility.</p>
